TERMS OF REFERENCE Alberta Branch President

Preamble/Purpose

The President is the primary representative of the CIPHI Alberta Branch and shall represent the CIPHI Alberta Branch to the best of his or her ability.

Responsibilities/Required Duties

- Serve as a public spokesperson for the CIPHI Alberta Branch and express the position of the CIPHI Alberta Branch on issues related to Environmental Health
- Preside at all meetings of the CIPHI Alberta Branch, CIPHI Alberta Branch Executive, and Executive Board or name a member of the Executive Board to act on his or her behalf
- Participate as an ex-office member on all committees
- Represent the CIPHI Alberta Branch at meetings of the CIPHI National Executive Council
- Provide the CIPHI Alberta Branch Executive with regular updates on the activities of the CPHI National Executive Council
- Respond on demand to all issues regarding a response from the CIPHI Alberta Branch or delegate a committee to develop a response to the issues
- Delegate responsibilities to other members of the CIPHI Alberta Branch Executive Board as needed
- Represent the CIPHI Alberta Branch on the Concordia University of Edmonton advisory meetings
- Work in close contact with the Past President and President-Elect

Membership

Regular, retired or life members are eligible to serve as President

Length of Term

- The length of the term shall be two years
- The Branch President should not hold two or more offices at the same time

Operation
