# IN MEMORIAM



Dr Sheela Basrur, the former Ontario Chief Medical Officer of Health (CMOH), passed away peacefully on June 2, 2008 at the Grand River Regional Cancer Centre in Kitchener, Ontario. She was survived by her family, friends, colleagues and admirers not only in Ontario, but throughout the international community.

Her battle with Leiomyosarcoma, a rare form of cancer, was a battle that she bravely disclosed to the world upon stepping down from her position on December 6, 2006 to undergo treatment. Her struggle with this personal challenge and ability to speak openly about her diagnosis and progressive treatment were an inspiration to many whose lives were being threatened by cancer.

After completing her Masters degree in Health Services in Community Medicine from the University of Toronto in 1987 Dr. Basrur was appointed Medical Officer of Health (MOH) at the East York Health Unit. In 1988 she became the first MOH for the newly amalgamated City of Toronto. It was during her tenure here that she championed a range of public health issues including the Dine Safe inspection system, cosmetic pesticide control and banning smoking in restaurants. International recognition came when Dr. Basrur was thrust to the forefront during the SARS crisis of 2003 which she handled in her usual calm and proficient manner.

In 2004 Dr. Basrur was appointed Chief MOH and Deputy Minister of Public Health for Ontario in an unprecedented move by the Legislative Assembly. Also to her credit is a comprehensive 2005 report to the Legislature that revealed the many challenges and initiatives necessary to rebuild the public health system in Ontario.

# Dr. Basrur

As well, she oversaw the passing of the Smoke Free Ontario Act in 2006, the establishment of the arms-length Agency for Health Protection and Promotion in 2007 and the release of a major report on childhood obesity.

All of these achievements earned Dr. Basrur the Amethyst Award, which is the highest award granted to a member of the Ontario Public Service. She also received the Order of Ontario, Ontario's highest honour, from the Lieutenant Governor of Ontario, the Honourable David Onley, at a special ceremony held by her hospital bedside on April 10, 2008.

The scope of the many awards and honours bestowed on Dr. Basrur defy description. Among others, she was awarded honorary doctoral degrees from Ryerson and York Universities and a similar honour was being planned by the University of Toronto in the same month that she died.

Ontario and the public health community have lost a woman who was the epitome of an honourable public servant and public health leader. As we mourn her passing let us take comfort in the former CMOH's exemplary life as a person of great wisdom, warmth and integrity who was particularly committed to the people of Ontario. Her leadership, conviction and courage earned her the love, respect and admiration of all Ontarians.

The Province, the public health community and particularly the Canadian Institute of Public Health Inspectors (CIPHI), Ontario Branch Inc. join in mourning the passing of an outstanding public servant whose name and contributions will be immortalized in our history. She was undoubtedly not only Ontario's petite and perfect CMOH, but also a true doctor whose character, knowledge and wisdom will keep the pages of public health history alive.
